General Business

Technical Items

- Scott raised an issue with the Herald distributor and was advised to contact Power Spark in the UK for assistance. He also had questions about the choke systems as well. In addition there are also fuel pump leaks. An electronic fuel pump was recommended. But wait there's more; he believes the speedo is inaccurate. Maybe send the speedo to Ringwood Speedos for a revamp.
- Paul covered the work done on Trevor on behalf of Guy Langford;
The engine and gearbox are up and running, the aluminium firewall is being welded for strength, the dash layout is almost finished, the radiator is in place and the wiring loom is ready to install. Once the firewall is installed, we have to work out how to install the pedal box without too many modifications. We then install the pedal box with all hydraulics and the collapsible steering column. The pedal box will be a challenge. Guy and I will be calling on you all for ideas and assistance.
- Dave Rogers raised the issue of tyres. We tend not to give them much thought apart from checking the tyre pressures (hopefully). Given the cars do not cover many miles or kilometres they can easily

become old and hard. They will still have plenty of tread but in wet weather they will have no grip which may cause you to have an accident. In addition, there is a higher likelihood of blowing tyres. They do have a DOT code which will tell you when the tyre was manufactured. It is expressed in week and year. There is no legal age requirement to replace them but a rule of thumb is every ten years or when you start to go sideways around corners.

The meeting was closed at 8.49 pm.

Break the Ice Gala Event - 26 July 2026

We enjoyed a crisp, if not icy, sunny morning brunch of the usual Club BBQ fare. Again, more muttering about consumption of Good Coffee, being further supported with Not So Little Somethings. All in all, a great drive, no dramas and much chit chat was had by all. Proceedings were formalised by the conduct of our pagan ritual, with a backup product sample being supplied from a container brought along by our President. Unlike last year, when a tree decided to spontaneously self-destruct near one of our party (John Mc), no trees were harmed during the proceedings.

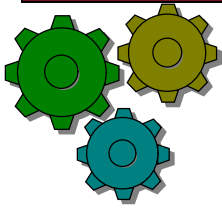


Council ACT Motoring Clubs News - Dave Rogers Recognised for Long-term Service

Why the topless Triumph Herald has a chassis, too

If you could only borrow a Herald 1200 convertible for an afternoon, you would make two happy discoveries:

1. The sheer fun of driving an open car. When the sun shines, down with the hood and it shines on you. Trees and fields are no longer pictures behind glass. And you aren't cooped up, either. You are in the country, out of doors properly—and summer belongs to you.

But what has all this to do with a technical thing like a chassis? That's the second of your happy discoveries.

Come to think of it you wouldn't need to borrow a 1200 convertible for an afternoon, twenty minutes would be ample. As your nearest Standard-Triumph dealer will show you—with pleasure, without obligation.

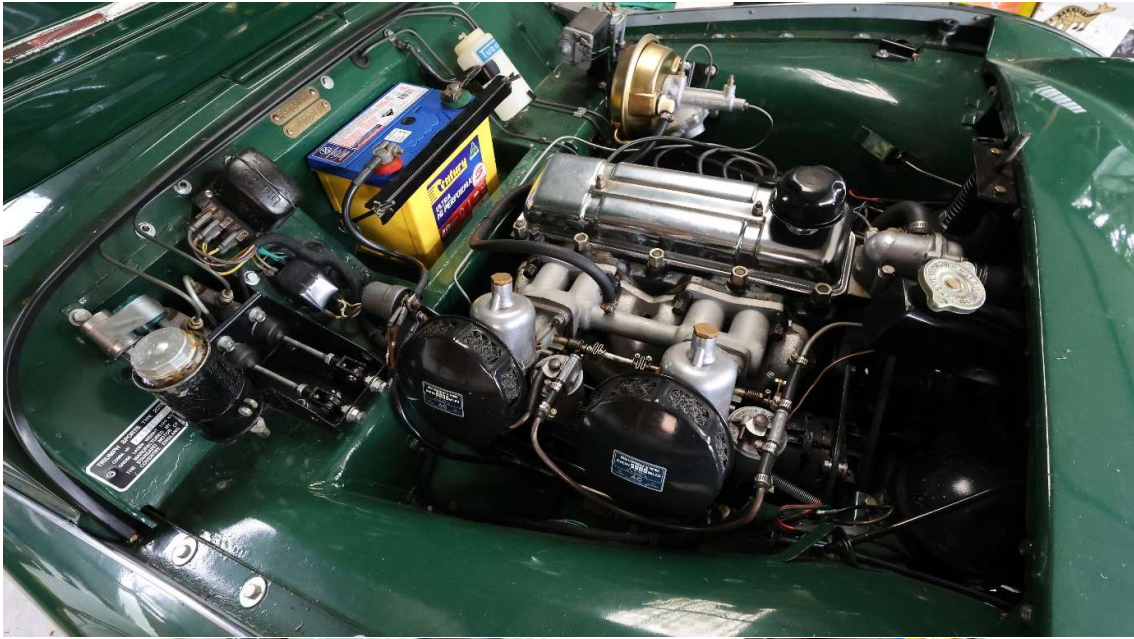
